Following an amazing speech from volunteer of the year Steve Hogan, CFA Acting Assistant Chief Fire Officer Geoff McGill spoke about the significance of the National Medal and what it

to Antarctica. Rachael provided several practical takeaways for members explaining why respect trumps harmony every time; how 'no triangles' can enhance integrity; what emperor penguins can teach us about collaboration; the importance and focussing on the little things after 'the bacon wars'

Rachael's story described by volunteers in attendance as 'amazing', 'brilliant' and 'inspiring' with a number keen to purchase her book 'Leading on the Edge'.

The audience welcomed CFA Chief Executive Officer Natalie MacDonald who discussed her vision for CFA and answered a variety of open questions from the participants

Natalie's session was punctuated by an afternoon Q&A panel with numerous leaders from across CFA engaging with volunteers and answering questions on a variety of topics including diversity, wellbeing, brigade sustainability vehicle design community safety and training.

The day was well received with volunteers appreciating the opportunity to learn some new ideas, meet some new people, and be heard by key decision makers within CFA.

Each of the members were congratulated on their service to CFA and extremely humbled to be recognised in this way.

65 YEARS FOR ICON

Warburton Fire Brigade icon Barry Marshall has been presented with a 65 year service medal signifying his wonderful contribution to his brigade, the local community and CFA.

Joining the brigade in 1956, Barry has been a key member ever since.

He was first elected to office as 1st Lieutenant in 1973 and five years later became Captain. He was a brilliant leader and much progress was made under his Captaincy which spanned 22 years. He also served as a DGO of the former Upper Yarra Group. Such is his standing Barry is still President of the brigade.

In 2000, Barry was awarded the fire services highest honour, the Australian Fire Service Medal.

When speaking about the major historical bushfires of the region, Barry considers Warburton as fortunate in escaping major destruction, particularly during Black Saturday.

During his service with Warburton Brigade Barry was heavily involved in the construction of a new fire station and the current building utilised by the brigade. The station houses Warburton Salvage, which is named in his honour. He was a key driver in acquiring the unit for the brigade and community.

In recalling his service Barry paid tribute to his family for their unwaivering support throughout his service.

He still enjoys the camaraderie of CFA knowing he can walk into any brigade across the state and share a mutual respect amongst fellow firefighters, and even though he has served 65 vears can still contribute.

Captain Hazel Clothier was full of praise for Barry's lifetime service with the brigade. "I think it's very humbling for the whole brigade to see such dedication and commitment and it was a delight to be able to share that with him and his family and acknowledge all that he's given to this community and the continuation of support given to us all."

According to Captain Hazel his experience and the knowledge he has is immeasurable in helping the brigade.

"He's always been in Warburton, he knows this township and the land and the fires that have been here before. He knows the way the weather and fire behaves in this valley, whilst the majority of us at the brigade are probably still newcomers to the area. Being able to have that living history here is immeasurable."
