As you know, Victoria is one of the most bushfire prone parts of the world and it is important for FFMVic and CFA, at this time of the year, to undertake planned burns in order to reduce fuels to minimise the impact and spread of bushfire. Keeping communities safe requires significant effort throughout the year and not just during the peak of our high risk weather season.

After a successful season of training and minimal deployment, the CH47 Chinook helicopter has now returned to the northern hemisphere but will return to Victoria's aviation fleet for the next highrisk fire season.

As we head into April, and





with the Easter long weekend fast approaching, I hope everyone enjoys a well-deserved break and thank you again to all of our emergency service personnel for their efforts over our high risk weather season and with support to Queensland and NSW over the past month.

# **VESEP GRANTS OPEN NOW**

The 2022-2023 Volunteer Emergency Services Equipment Program (VESEP) is open for applications. These grants help ensure that the State's hardworking emergency services volunteers continue to have the latest, fit-for-purpose equipment and vehicles they require to do their life saving work

On 5 April Minister for Emergency Services **Jaclyn Symes** announced the popular Volunteer Emergency Services Equipment Program (VESEP) is open for applications.

Said Minister Symes: "Our selfless emergency services volunteers are there when we need them most and these grants are all about helping ensure they have the latest equipment to do what they do best — protect communities and save lives.

"These grants have been going strong for 20 years and we're proud to support the vital fundraising work that these brigades do.

"I encourage all our volunteer groups right across the state to apply."

VESEP is an ongoing, annual program that provides emergency services volunteer groups with grants to help fund operational equipment, including the purchase of new vehicles, trucks, tankers, watercraft and trailers.

Volunteer groups can also put the money towards minor facility improvements, including refurbishments and amenities, such as kitchens and change rooms.

In 2022-23, more than \$14.6 million in grants are available to volunteer organisations across Victoria including:

- More than \$10.60 million for volunteer CFA brigades.
- More than \$2.39 million for VICSES units.
- More than \$350,000 for Marine Search and Rescue (MSAR) units, including the Australian Volunteer Coast Guard Association (AVCGA).
- More than \$835,000 for Life Saving Victoria clubs.
- More than \$380,000 for other volunteer agencies.

Groups can apply for a grant up to \$150,000 excluding GST, with the Government providing \$2 for every \$1 of funding contributed by the local volunteer group.

The program offers five cat-

egories to CFA brigades and groups; Volunteer amenities \$<5K; Minor works \$<120K; Operational equipment; Specialist appliances and Field Command Vehicles (FCV's); and Tankers.

VFBV has published a help pack that offers practical suggestions and complements the EMV and CFA Guidelines and application forms.

Applications close on the 31st May 2022, with a ministerial announcement expected in September. Reach out if you need help with your application.

## PLANNED BURNING PROGRAM ON THE GO

Comments from Chief Fire Officer Chris Hardman (FFMVic)

March was a busy month for Forest Fire Management Victoria (FFMVic) crews with our planned burning program taking advantage of the good weather to ramp up activity across the state.

While we look to burn all year-round when the conditions are right, as you would know typically 80 and 90 per cent of planned burn delivery is carried out during autumn, in particular March and April.

At the time of writing, we had completed 128 planned burns treating 17,249 hectares of public land and we have been able to focus on some of the most important burns that

deliver the most effective bushfire risk reduction. In addition, to that, a further 6,366 hectares has been treated by non-burning methods including slashing and mulching.

With such a busy time in the planned burn space, I would like to thank our FFMVic crews for their hard work and dedication to deliver our program.

And I would also like to take this opportunity to thank those Country Fire Authority crews who have supported FFMVic's planned burn program to date and into the future. Your help ensures we
