75 years for Rye

Rye Fire Brigade celebrated its 75th anniversary of serving the local community at its presentation dinner last month at which Captain Eddy Matt, on the brigade's behalf, accepted a 75 year certificate from CFA which was presented by Assistant Chief Fire Officer Jamie Hansen (pictured below).

During the evening a Brigade Life Membership was presented to former Captain **Glenn Diamond**, who originally joined the brigade in 2003 and served as a DGO of Peninsula Group from 2021-2022.

Glenn, who has contributed in many others ways to the brigade including as an operational firefighter, junior leader, group delegate, and strike team leader, was thanked for his wonderful contribution to Rye Fire Brigade.

There was also a presentation of flowers to retiring member **Dawn Hind,** for her invaluable contribution to the brigade spanning 54 years.

Numerous brigade awards were also presented during the evening.

Winner of the coveted firefighter of the year award was **Rob Thompson** with Lieutenant **Tim Griffiths** and Lieutenant **Locky Yanner** taking out the runners-up awards.

The encouragement award was shared by **Owen Yanner** and **Drew Cole** whilst **Rob Thompson** and **Bob O'Toole** shared the Captain's award.

Recently awarded with the Australasian Fire Authorities Council Industry Award for fostering resilient communities was **Kelly Stoner**, who was also recognised during the evening.

There were also special awards for tunouts presented to Lieutenats Tim Griffiths (1073) and Rob Thompson (1063), former Captain **Peter Ellis** (1530) and Captain Eddy Matt (1712).

Rye Fire Brigade was originally formed in 1945 but was not registered with CFA until 1948. The first fire station was

located on the foreshore before it later relocated to the current site.

The early equipment of the brigade was mainly privately owned including knapsacks, 44 gallon tanks on utes and a member's truck and the foreshore committee trust purchased knapsacks and hand beaters.

The initial station was a small weatherboard shed provided by the foreshore trust to house the new truck and was the brigade's home until 1967 when the brigade built a new station.

Rye Fire Brigade has played an important role in many fire events locally and further afield including the Black Saturday fires and more recent Black Summer fires.

EMERGENCY SERVICES EXPO SUCCESS

An Emergency Services Expo was held at Yarck Recreation Reserve last month. The weather was fine and the community turned out in droves and were impressed with the latest CFA training tools and training techniques.

The Expo was also well attended by first responders, some of whom had not previously witnessed some of our high tech training modules. CFA's Terry Ouroumis ran the CFA SIM Table which is an engaging and interactive 3D simulator used to demonstrate bushfire behaviour and suppression options. Terry projected the local terrain onto the SIM Table so the community could see just how quickly fire can travel so easily across the landscape. The SIM Table is available for brigade training.

The Fire Extinguisher Virtuality Reality Unit was also popular particularly with the kids but it is an excellent training tool. The more comprehensive Virtual Reality Unit will be used for more serious training and will be at Alexandra Brigade till early November and can be booked by other brigades after that.

The Smoke House was also used for BA demonstrations.

The car fire prop was a real attraction (pictured below). The highlight of the event was a multi-agency MVA scenario using the car fire prop. The scenario began with a simulated call to 000 explaining what information 000 would require and the importance of staying calm and providing precise, correct directions.

First on scene were SES and CFA to secure the scene and extinguish the fire before the dummy passenger was extracted. SES provided immediate first aid until the ambulance arrived, then continued to help the Paramedics to stabilize the patient in readiness for transport to hospital. The announcer, Paul Tierney, explained that the area must be preserved to enable the Police to investigate the cause of the incident. After the investigation CFA

was engaged to clear the road of debris and spilled fuel. There was a lot of positive feedback from the community, all members who left with a much greater understanding of the huge task involved during any incident.

CFA, SES, AV and VicPol worked well together as one competent, unit.

There were a number of other organisations providing safety information as well, AV's Shocktober campaign, Forest Fire Management, Game Management Authority, Murrindindi Council, Army Signals along with CFA's Com Ed Unit and Rehab Unit. There was plenty to keep the kids entertained, providing the opportunity to engage with the adults.

All in all, the Expo proved to be a great community event full of valuable fire safety information.
