Scope	This Standard Operating Procedure applies to all CFA members.				
Definitions	The following definitions apply to this Standard Operating Procedure:				
	CFA member: A person who is registered by the Authority as a volunteer officer or member of a brigade and/or a person who is employed by CFA.				
Objective	To establish the procedures for logging of fire alarm tests.				
Procedure	CFA responsibilities where alarm monitoring terminates				
	1.1 Log name and company of tester, as well as date, time, premise and circuit.				
	2. Owner/Occupier responsibilities				
	 It is the responsibility of the system owners to comply with the Australian Standards. 				
	2.2 The testing of Automatic Fire Detection and Alarm Systems shall be as required in AS 1851.8 – 1987.				
	2.3 AS 1851.8 – 1987 requires systems to be inspected, tested and maintained in accordance with the relevant procedures contained in the standard.				
	2.4 Regular maintenance is classified into three (3) levels of procedure which shall be performed:				
	2.4.1 Weekly, only where:				
	2.4.1.1 The connection to the fire control station is not supervised; or				
	2.4.1.2 The Regulatory Authority deems it necessary.				
	2.4.2 Monthly on all systems.2.4.3 Yearly on all systems.
